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Be Curious. Stay Curious.

Being curious means being eager know or learn something. Observe a child. As it moves about, it wants to understand and relate to things it sees. The questions are simple: What, How, Why ... By getting the answers, the child starts to understand the surroundings.

The basic requirement for true learning is curiosity. Only when you keep asking questions, can you blossom as a learner. "Why so?" you may ask. When would you appreciate good food - when you are hungry or when you are half full? When you are half full, you have to be fed food by force. When you are really hungry, you eat food without anyone's compulsion. Similarly, if you are not curious, others have to work hard to get you interested in the subject and teach. Instead, if you are curious, you go out to learn about the subject yourself.

It is also true that as they grow, children become less curious. It is not that they are not interested. It is just that they are afraid of asking questions. They become more conscious of the surroundings and are more guarded. When you are more concerned about "What the others think of me if I ask silly questions?" that is when you kill your curiosity.

All learning is the result of asking questions. You must ask questions of yourself. For example, if there is a new chapter that your teacher has started in the classroom, you must find out:

- Why you are studying this topic?
- What does this topic cover?
- How is this topic different compared to others?

And once you have the initial clarity about the chapter, you must then read on and get the details. So, this way, the subject becomes easy like a story and you enjoy studying the subject.

This is the secret of becoming a good student. Become curious. And cultivate this habit. Let the mind keep asking questions. You should never put a leash on the eager mind. If in a class of 40 students, you feel shy of asking questions or more than a couple of questions to your teacher, write down the things you want to know. Then go home and read the text book. For added information, go to the Internet. In today's world, it is not difficult to find information. When you know more about a topic,

you get more clarity. In the process, your fundamentals become strong. Once your fundamentals are strong, you are able to understand the subject better and in greater depth. Thus your concept formation is good. When your concept formation is good, you are able to solve even difficult problems easily.



Once you start solving complex problems, you get more confidence in your abilities to take on bigger challenges. This is exactly the true purpose of education. You must liberate yourself from the shackles of self-doubt and realize your potential.

When you become curious, you become more innovative and creative. You become more open minded and logical.

Take the first step now. Get curious about what you are doing. And stay that way.
